- Manuscripts should be prepared with Microsoft Word format. Use 1 inch margins all around, 1.5 spacing, and 12-points Times New Roman. Number the pages consecutively starting with the first page.
- A manuscript of full-length should not be more than 10,000 words (this limit includes figures, references, and tables).
- The abstract should not be more than 250 words and about 4-6 keywords should be given,
- The author should indicate his/her personal contact details including brief bio-data.

- Notification of acceptance: March 4, 2023
- Deadline for submission of papers in 10,000 words: March 22, 2023
